In a rural, hard-to-reach area of Blantyre district in southern Malawi, Ephraim Louis cannot imagine where his life would be without the solar panel on the roof of his house. “I am not a captive of darkness anymore,” says Louis, 42. All. While much international commentary highlights China's industrial overcapacity or geopolitical motives in clean energy sectors, insights from Addis Ababa during the second Africa Climate Summit (ACS2) suggest a more complex and dynamic story, driven more by realities on the ground than policy. 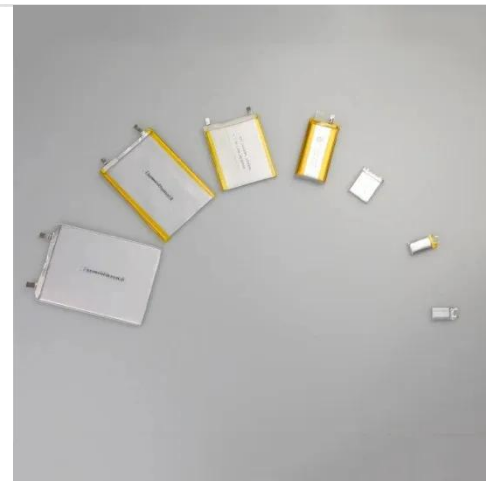
